

How to Appeal Your Assessment

There are three possible steps to the annual appeal process:

- 1. Contact the Assessor before the March Board of Review
- 2. Petition at March Board of Review
- 3. Petition at Michigan Tax Tribunal

Assessor:

Contact the Assessor by phone, email or scheduled appointment to discuss your property record card if you are concerned about information on form L-4400 (i.e. "This is Not a Tax Bill"), received in February. Many questions can be cleared up without a formal petition to the March Board of Review. If you are still dissatisfied with your property record card, petition at the March Board of Review.

March Board of Review:

Conducted during the second week of March. To file an appeal with the March Board of Review, complete an appeal form L-4035: https://www.michigan.gov/treasury/-/media/Project/Websites/treasury/Forms/2001/l4035f.pdf?rev=f780bf9ba4934071b0de59fd0c2bb8f1&hash=F7F3471D750D7268DE8D417E5D63A28A

Remember to bring supporting documentation. You may present your appeal in person, or in writing. To appeal in writing, mail your petition and documentation to the *Board of Review, 102 McNutt Rd, Iron River, MI 49935*

Petitions will not be accepted through email

Michigan Tax Tribunal:

You may not appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal or the State Tax Commission unless you first protest to the Board of Review.
